



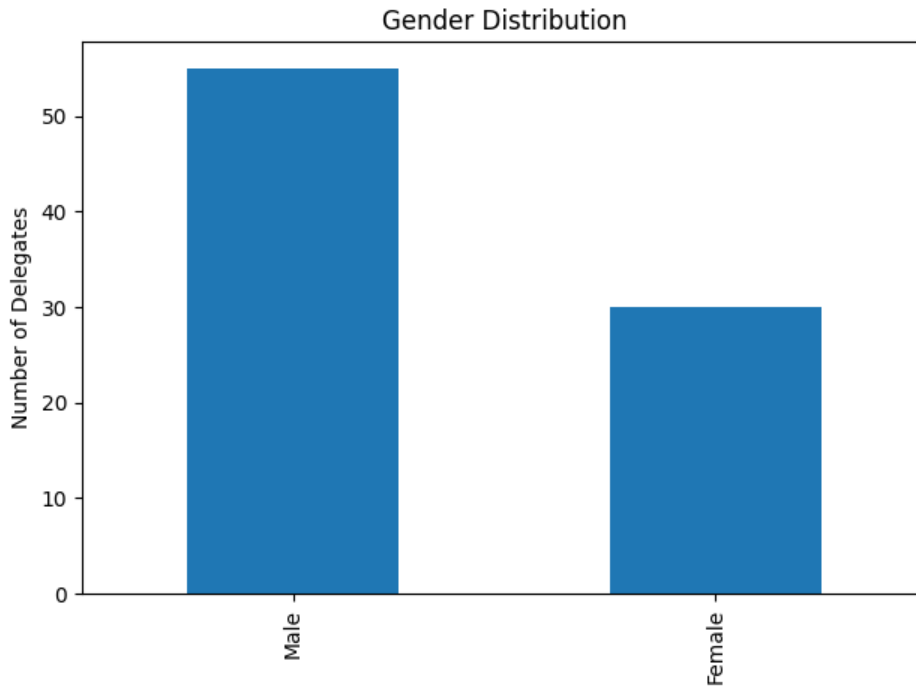
1ST TSP NATIONAL DELEGATES CONFERENCE IN NUMBERS (NDC) & 5th Anniversary 3rd December 2025 |

A total of 112 Delegates attended the NDC with 88 delegates successfully signing off their attendance digitally while 24 completed manual forms.

The digital attendance exercise was piloted as part of TSP's broader digital transformation agenda. The pilot was highly successful, demonstrating the feasibility, efficiency, and strategic value of fully digital and virtual party processes. The Party is actively considering scaling this approach towards a completely virtual and digital system, with several supporting initiatives currently work in progress.

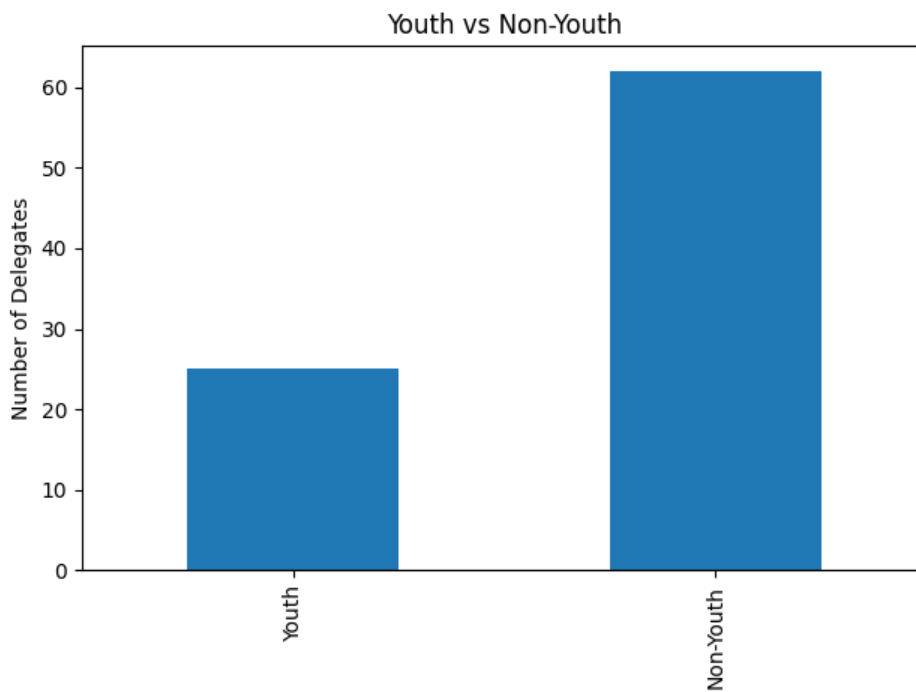
Gender Representation

Out of the 88 delegates captured digitally, 55 were male (62.5%) and 30 were female (34.1%). This reflects meaningful female participation while highlighting the opportunity to further strengthen gender balance in future party activities.



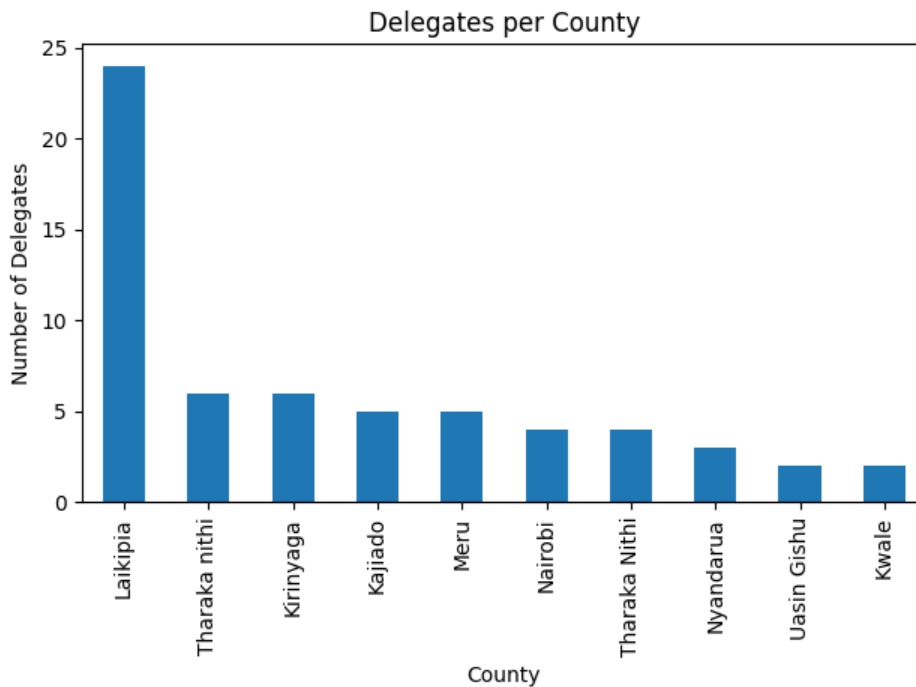
Youth Participation

Youth delegates, defined as those born in 1990 and after, accounted for 25 delegates (28.4%), while non-youth delegates accounted for 62 (70.5%). Youth participation was evident across multiple counties, reinforcing the Party's shift towards digital-first engagement.



County Representation

Delegates were drawn from 24 counties across the country. Laikipia County recorded the highest representation with 24 delegates, followed by Tharaka Nithi (6), Kirinyaga (6), Kajiado (5), and Meru (5). With our future strategy focused on strengthening county-facing Party Structures, this is bound to improve.



PWD Representation

Only one Delegate identified as PW – as a Party, we must do better to attract this critical membership in the interest of inclusivity.

Skills, Professions and Delegate Feedback

Delegates provided information on their skills, professions, and areas of expertise, including governance, business, social work, education, ICT, community leadership, and public service. This data provides a strong foundation for forming specialized taskforces, advisory groups, and issue-based committees.

Delegate comments reflected optimism about the Party's growth, strong commitment to grassroots mobilization, calls for enhanced youth involvement, and support for the continued use of digital tools to improve communication and participation.
